
Safe Arrival	
One of our greatest priorities is ensuring all students arrive to school safely each day. Parents/guardians of students who attend our school now have the option to report their child's absence in advance using a toll-free number, the PowerSchool Parent Portal or an app!	
SchoolMessenger SafeArrival – an absence management system that improves student safety and makes it easy for families to inform their child's school if they will be away – powers all three of these options.

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All students in **Grades Primary-Six are NOT permitted to have their cells phones during the school day**. All phones need to be put away and out of site for the entire school day, including during recess and lunch. We understand this will be an adjustment for some people. Please share the below information with your child as this is how we will be responding to students who are not following this new Provincial Directive.

- The first time a student is found using their cell phone when not permitted, they'll be reminded and asked to turn it off and put it away.
- The second time, they'll be asked to leave it with the teacher until the end of class or break. Their parent or guardian will be notified.
- The third time, they'll be referred to the office and the cell phone will be left in the office for the day. Their parent or guardian will be notified.
- The fourth time, they'll be referred to the office and the cell phone will be held until a parent or guardian meets with the Principal to retrieve the phone. Their parent or guardian will be notified.

You can also receive notice of school and bus cancellations by e-mail or text message by following the link on the front page (left side) of the HRCE website.

In case of a school closure during the day, you can help us to ensure that your child is dismissed safely by making sure that we have up-to-date contact information.

Visiting the School and Volunteering

A reminder for those considering volunteering for anything upcoming in their child's class that both the Criminal Records Check with Vulnerable Sector Check and Child Abuse Registry Check must be completed. Combined Classes

Many people have questions about combined classes. Here is some information that you may find helpful. Today's elementary schools commonly include combined grade classes. We have several at BLT Sr. Elementary this year. Combined grade classes consist of two groups of students who have birth dates within a two-year range. Each group is working towards the achievement of its own set of grade-level expectations. Even though there is a greater age range in a combined grade class, there is much diversity and a variety of ability levels in any classroom. It is important that all classes be considered a unified community of learners, where the individual needs and qualities of each student are honoured and nurtured.

Combined grade classes are formed to maintain a balance of class sizes across the school, when there is uneven enrollment at particular grade levels. We also have to take Provincial Cap sizes in mind. Within each classroom setting there are children at various stages of social, physical, and intellectual development. This is true regardless of age or grade level. Research has found that students in combined classes have a good sense of belonging, support, security and confidence. As well, combined grade classes have been found to foster:

Social growth and Independence Respect for others and increased motivation to learn

The teacher may use many teaching strategies that:

- Provide a learning environment with a range of materials and resources to meet the needs of students;
- Use direct instruction with individuals, small groups or the whole class to develop necessary skills and concepts;
- Establish various groupings of students such as cooperative groups, pairs, interest groups or ability groups to promote learning among peers;
- Develop integrated curriculum approaches which allow separate curriculum areas to be integrated in a meaningful way; and
- Develop student choice and ownership through activities that are tailored to each grade.

Assessment and evaluation in a combined grade class focuses on the achievement of grade related expectations. Teachers tailor assessments, cluster expectations and create a continuum of learning of skills to meet the needs of both grades. Teachers may use assessment tools such as: rubrics, exemplars, checklists, and anecdotal comments.

We are having a Lockdown Drill this Month!

Dear Parents and Guardians,

The safety and security of our students and staff is a top priority for BLT Sr. Elementary and the Halifax Regional Center of Education. We have been implementing a number of measures as part of a comprehensive plan aimed at ensuring our school remains a safe place for our students to learn.

One of the procedures our school will be practicing is a lockdown drill. During a lockdown drill, classroom doors are secured and the students remain inside the room until instructed by the teacher to resume their activities. All exterior doors are locked and no one is permitted to enter or leave the building.

Students are kept inside the school and classrooms when circumstances make it safer to stay in the classroom rather than evacuate. Just as we prepare our students to properly respond to a fire drill, they also need to be aware of the proper response during a lockdown drill. These drills should be treated with the same level of importance as fire drills.

Please be assured that staff at our school will spend time discussing the importance of this procedure with students prior to running a drill. We will also take time after the drill to remind them that it was only a practice and there was no danger. When possible, our School Liaison Officer/RCMP may assist us in conducting the lockdown drills just as the Fire Department assists with evacuation drills.

Please take the time to speak with your son/daughter about this procedure and reinforce its importance. We practice these drills to ensure our school remains a safe place for teaching and learning.

Other Reminders:

Bussing

Please be reminded to check for your child's bus stop information, which can be found at https://hrce.mybusplanner.ca/. (Please register your child if you have not yet done so.) Please be reminded that at this time of the year the pick-up and drop off times will be a bit slower until everyone gets into the swing of school. Please be reminded that the HRCE Transportation Team can support your family with all of your busing needs; please contact them to get any busing situations figured out 902-431-4723 or transportation@hrce.ca. The bussing system sends messages if a bus will be more than 15 minutes late.

Student Drop Off

If you are dropping a student off during the morning please do so in the area painted orange up to our orange barriers. Please have your child prepped and ready to hop out as soon as you pull up. Parents will not need to exit the car to help with a bag as this is part of a student's growing independence. Also please do not have your child exit your car in the bus area and walk through the buses. We always want them to be safe and that is why we have made our drop off area highly visible. This year the Junior School will use a crosswalk drop off location but we ask our parents to be patient until able to get to our orange zone.

Telephone Messages

Please be reminded that teachers will not be able to return any telephone messages until after the students have left, returning all messages within 48 hours. Also, our school is not able to give students last minute messages about any changes to their dismissal procedures for that day. Students are not to use cellular telephones while at school or even have them visible. We can always make arrangements to convey a student's message to their family during the day.
