- 2. If the concern is not resolved, contact the school administration.
- 3. If the issue remains unresolved, you can reach out to HRCE's Family Navigators, who can provide support and connect you with the school supervisor.
- 4. If the matter is still unresolved, you can initiate a formal review process outlined in the Parent/Guardian Concern Policy. This will involve an investigation by the appropriate HRCE Directors. To begin, please complete the Parent Concern Reporting Form on page 3 of the Policy.
