- LM3 Data: We have identified students who did not meet in the areas of Math, Reading, and
 Writing, and have determined next steps to provide additional support either as a whole class or
 small group intervention.
- Literacy:
 - We have purchased magnetic letters and cookie sheets to create magnetic letter trays to support phonological work in both English and French grade 2 classes.
 - Purchased license for on-line reading program for grade 2 teachers to support Home Reading (Raz Kids).
 - Early Literacy and Math support teachers continue to work with classroom teachers, both as whole class support and small group work.

Update re: Path to BLT Trails (Katie Sherren):

- Currently there is an unmarked path from the BLT Trails to BLT SR, behind the fence of the soccer field. The path is overgrown with trees, not safe for students to use.
- If this path was cleared and safe, we could encourage students to use active modes of transportation to get to school.
- I contacted BLT Trails, they will discuss this project at their next board meeting.
- I contacted Nathan Pick, he is a Forest Technician within the department of Natural Resources. He indicated that for this project, we would need support from the BLT Trails as they hold the letter of authority for that section on the rail corridor. Either BLT Trails or BLT Elementary would need to take on the project and maintain it.
- Ms. Williams will contact the operations team with HRCE.

<u>Update re: safety at drop off time at Maplewood subdivision entrance (Karri Lynn Davidson):</u>

- Karri Lynn emailed Janet Steele, RCMP liaison, and SAC members. There have been challenges with parking and student drop offs on Mountain Maple Dr. We would like to see increased enforcement, improved signage, and continued education to families.
- BLT SR included in newsletter: "If you have any traffic concerns regarding the streets surrounding the school, including Mountain Maple Drive, please don't hesitate to contact 311 or the RCMP to report them. Your feedback helps keep our community safe."
- RCMP member responded: "I have requested the watch members that have been assigned as the RCMP liaison for the schools to conduct some patrols in that area when they can. This would be based around operational needs at drop off times and their shift schedules".

• In response to Karri Lynn's 311 submission, they will observe pick up and/or drop off times in the Maplewood subdivision to determine what changes will need to be made to ensure safety of our students and community.
